Everyone living in the property must not have a bank balance, when added together, of over £5,000. How can the grant help me? A qualified

contractor will carry out a free home security assessment and fit home security equipment. What additional home security measures are available to me? Measures include, but are not limited to\*: Additional locks for doors and windows, Door Chains, Door viewers, Window alarms. \*some types of locks and security measures can only be fitted depending on the type of existing windows and doors.


